



Alberta Wheat Dealer License Application

Alberta Wheat Commission (AWC) represents 14,000 wheat farmers across Alberta. All companies purchasing wheat from an Alberta farmer are required to deduct a \$0.70 per tonne check-off (service charge or levy) and remit it to AWC.

AWC appreciates the support from our traders, as these check-off contributions from growers are a valuable investment for the industry. AWC reinvest the check-off we collect into our main program areas – research, extension, markets, communications and policy. We use check-off dollars to breed new varieties, fine tune agronomic practices, improve disease and pest resistance, develop new markets and ensure there are no trade barriers in existing markets, and communicate extension information that will help growers make business decisions on their farm.

A research study by the Western Grains Research Foundation found the return on investment from producer check-offs on wheat is over \$20 for every dollar invested. That return extends up and down the value chain to feedlots, livestock producers, seed growers, food processors, trade industry, and agricultural suppliers. Check-off investments create value for all parts of Alberta's agricultural sector.

Organizations such as AWC have also been successful in leveraging government and industry funding to match our check-off investments.

Bi-Annual License

Please ensure your wheat dealer license is issued by completing the enclosed bi-annual Dealer License Application form. Dealer Licenses must be renewed in odd numbered years regardless of when the license is issued. This means that licenses issued in both 2015 and 2016 need to be renewed in 2017. We are also asking that you provide us with the addresses for all elevator and other locations authorized as agents operating under your company. Upon receipt, we will issue new displayable licenses suitable for posting at each wheat dealer



location. When the licensing process is complete, all authorized dealers will be listed on the AWC website at www.albertawheat.com (if they choose to allow their names to be listed). Please return your dealer license application to AWC as soon as possible.

Grower Email Addresses

As you probably already know, capturing customer email address provides you with an efficient, effective and trustworthy means of communicating with your growers. It is the same for the AWC. We rely on producer email addresses to communicate effectively and efficiently with them, whether providing information about important upcoming events, or communicate new agronomic research findings that will aid Alberta wheat producers to increase farm gate revenues. If you have not already done so (and we thank you if you have), we are asking that dealers begin the transition to collecting email addresses from your producers. Including this information on remittance reports will save many producer dollars in printing and mailing costs (that can be diverted to other valuable initiatives), while also helping producers stay at the leading edge of industry information.

Wheat vs Feed Wheat

Please remember that when any type of wheat is purchased, the destination of the product (eg. feed market, milling, etc.) has no effect on the requirement to remit check-offs. DEALER LICENSE APPLICATION

According to the Marketing of Agricultural Products Act; Alberta Wheat Commission Plan Regulation, the definition of a dealer is as follows:

“Dealer” means a person or business operation purchasing or acquiring regulated product from a producer and includes, but is not limited to,

- (i) elevator companies, grain companies, grain dealers and grain brokers,
- (ii) processors and manufacturers of food, feed, fiber, fuel and industrial products,
- (iii) livestock and poultry producers and feeders who purchase or acquire regulated product from other producers, and
- (iv) persons who acquire regulated product from the producer for sale on the producer’s behalf.
